The challenges that lie ahead on our path are many....our collective ability to address these challenges are strong....the opportunities that will be realized from our efforts are great.

We will continue to grow a community in which our children and grandchildren can be proud.

John Kennedy once said, "Ask not what your Country can do for you but rather what can you do for your Country". The people of Collingwood have lived this statement for over one hundred years....and it continues here today. We see it in our newest residents that give so much to our community..... Through volunteer hours at the hospital, helping out with our library or becoming active in the many service clubs and churches, these people make a difference.

We see it in the founding families that built our Town out of Wilderness, in the Shipbuilders that carried our name around the world. Most importantly we see it in the eyes of our children and our children's children...a sincere hope and desire to experience a sense of community, to raise children, to work and to enjoy the fruit of their labour in later years.

I will ask staff effectively immediately to prepare an option paper for Council on alternate or in house legal services. The days of \$750,000 per year legal bills end now.

It is for this reason I will ask Council to immediately revoke the bylaw pertaining to outdoor patios in the Downtown Core. Clearly the men and women that own, operate and work in our many wonderful restaurants have a much better understanding of where their customers would prefer to sit than elected officials. Too much time and too many words have been spent on this issue. It is on this same Platform I will ask your Council to review our current approach in working with Industry in our Community. A sustainable economy must have good paying full time jobs that support families, mortgages, and education...and yes taxes. Our Council must create an environment where Private Business and Industry thrives. My pledge to those in industry and the private sector is that our Team will make that happen.

The needs of our residents are many and using prudent financial approaches we are going to examine alliances and partnerships the likes that have never been contemplated in the past. In short, our Team, your Council is going to have to think outside the box on a whole lot of different issues.

My promise is simple and straight forward. I will give this community every ounce of positive energy I can muster. I will work with my fellow Councilors in an open, positive and engaging manner. I will make decisions in the same way you would....because at the end of the day we all aspire to the same thing...a stronger more vibrant and united community. That is my promise to you and that starts today!
